

# **Classic Analogy Bridges**

The best strategy to use when completing analogies problems is the bridge sentence strategy. Bridge sentences are helpful because they enable the student to instantly recognize the answer pair by plugging it into the bridge sentence formulated from the question pair. If the bridge sentence works with both the question pair and answer pair, then you know you have found the correct answer. To learn more about bridge sentences, please look at the following examples:

#### **Function Bridge:**

#### SHOVEL: DIG

2) baby: cry3) cloud: rain4) fork: eat5) car: stop

1) bag:buy

A **shovel** is used to **dig**. A **fork** is used to **eat**.

#### Characteristic Bridge:

# CANDY: SWEET

man: strong
time: fast

3) money : powerful4) movie : exciting

5) fire: hot

A characteristic of a *candy* is to be *sweet*.

A characteristic of a *fire* is to be **hot** 

## Part to Whole Bridge:

#### FINGER: HAND

ball: game
clock: room
wheel: car
hat: suit
man: woman

A *finger* is part of a *hand*. A *wheel* is part of a car.

#### Degree Bridge:

# **BAD: TERRIBLE**

hard : difficult
hot : warm
funny : hilarious
right : wrong
young : new

Something that is extremely **bad** is **terrible**.

Something that is extremely **funny** is **hilarious**.

## Definition Bridge:

#### BOY: MAN

plant : flower
lamb : sheep
shirt : sweater
pond : lake
wind : fire

By definition, an adult **boy** is a **man**.

By definition, an adult *lamb* is a *sheep*.

#### Other:

# RING: FINGER

plant: tree
bag: jacket
suit: watch
necklace: neck
mountain: ocean

A *ring* is worn around the *finger*. A *necklace* is worn around the *neck*.

# Lack Bridge:

# **UGLY: BEAUTY**

serious : humor
painful : happiness

3) old:age4) hot:heat5) sweet:stree

5) sweet : strength

Something *ugly* lacks *beauty*. Something *serious* lacks *humor*.

#### Type/Kind Bridge:

#### WRENCH: TOOL

knee : leg
rose : flower
automobile : car
pencil : paper
school : punishment

A **wrench** is a type of **tool**. A **rose** is a type of **flower**.

# Other:

# BEES: HIVE

ants: city
humans: barn
birds: nest
snakes: house
bears: hotel

**Bees** make their home in a **hive**. **Birds** make their home in a **nest**.
